- 1. This chapter, 3:1-25, and the first six verses of chapter four are considered to be the hortatory (exhort ation) section of the Colossian spistle. This section is divided as follows:
 - 1. Colossians 3-1-4: The Colossians are exhorted to a lofty spiritual life.
 - 2. Colossians 3:5-8: They are told to put off their old vices: IMPURITY; MALICE; FILTHY COMMUNICATION ETC.
 - 3. Colossians 3:9-14: Put on the new man: Mercies, kindness; humbleness; Meekness ETC.
 - 4. Colossians 3:15-17: They are exhorted to let the Christ be their sovereign ruler.
 - 5. Colossians 3:18-25:4:1:

He ehorts all Christians to the discharge of their relative duties.

- 6. Colossians 4:2-6: Paul exhorts to constant prayer. Especially for Paul and his workers To wise conduct and edifying speed toward them that are without.
- 2. THE DUTIES AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE HIGHER SPIRITUAL LIFE - 1. "Seek those things which are above." What are the

above things?

- 1. All things pertaining to our new home ... The New Jerusalem. John 14:1-6
- 2. THEY ARE TO BE SOUGHT: implies:
 - (1) Our knowledge of them. We never seek for thing of wich we have no know ledge.
 - (2) Our longing for them. Hebrews 11:8-10
 - (3) Our anxious effort to realize them. Matt. 6:33
- 2. We should set our mind on things above because:
 - 1. There is nothing else worth our serious thought.
 - Matt. 16:26; 1.John 2:15-17
 2. Seeking those things above will keep you from over enxiety about the affairs of this life . Phil. 4:11-
 - 3. Seeking those things above will make the thought of death more pleasant as we move rapidly toward the narrow house. Phil. 1:23
