otherwise, the omission of one element leaves it
worthless: "Every one that heareth these sayings of
mine and doeth them not"
1. Every foundation which has not the sayings of Christ, all of them, is false.

- 3. Worldly wisdom is another faulty foundation. 1 Cor. 1:21;3:A
 - 1. Worldly wisdom is satisfying to the pride of man and popular with many.
 - 2. With needs that are infinite, men rest their hopes on minds that are finite.
 - 3. They forget that as a building must rest on a foundation stronger than itself, man's life must have a foundation stronger than man and surer than man's wisdom.
 - 4 <u>A mr. Ben Johnson is reported to have said</u>,"He that was only taught by himself had a fool for his master."
 - 1. Man's need are of this world and the next. Therefore, wisdom which is only of this world cannot meet his needs.n
 - 5. The handmaidens of wisdom are attractive:
 - 1. Science appears, but being in a search for truth, she has failed to consdier the source of truth, and has misssed God.
 - Computing the age of the rosks and discovering the mysteries of the ages, she has missed the Rock of Ages...the only sure foundation for the soul's of men.
