  - 2. Teaching without encouragement. (1) Hard, harsh, stinging, rebuking lessons may cause brethren to faint ... give up.
    - (2) Mebuke needed and will come in the right and proper proportions when God's word is preached. 2 Tim 4:2.
  - 3. Preachers often need encouragement. Many have fainted already and others are on the verge of it. Members can starve their prea
    - chers to death. HOW? (1) By coldness, indifference and lack of response. (2) Too much is expected of the preacher in
    - 1. He must be a go-getter; a public contact man. A man who can advise on all problems...good in caring for the sick...good in working with out-ofthe way members. Spend a lot of time visiting in homes...house to house.
