    1. To enquire of God.
  3. What Moses did:

2. Not to add to or deminish from the law.
  1. The character of acceptable obedience, Deuteronomy 4:2
    1. Entire...not partial, having respect to all that God reveals.
    2. Honest...neither altering, mutilating, adding to, nor subtracting from. Matt.5:19; 15:9; Tit.1:14
    3. Perserving. Gal. 6:9; Luke 21:19; Matt. 24:13  
Romans 5:3. MARK 12:13
  
3. To teach the law of God to their children.
  1. Deut. 4:9,10: We must be diligent in the religious training of our children.
  2. We learn: Parents must;
    1. Take heed to thyself.
    2. Keep thy soul diligently
    3. Teach thy children. Eph.6:4; 2 Tim.1:5
  
4. To obey the law. Deut.5:32; Joshua 1:7,8
